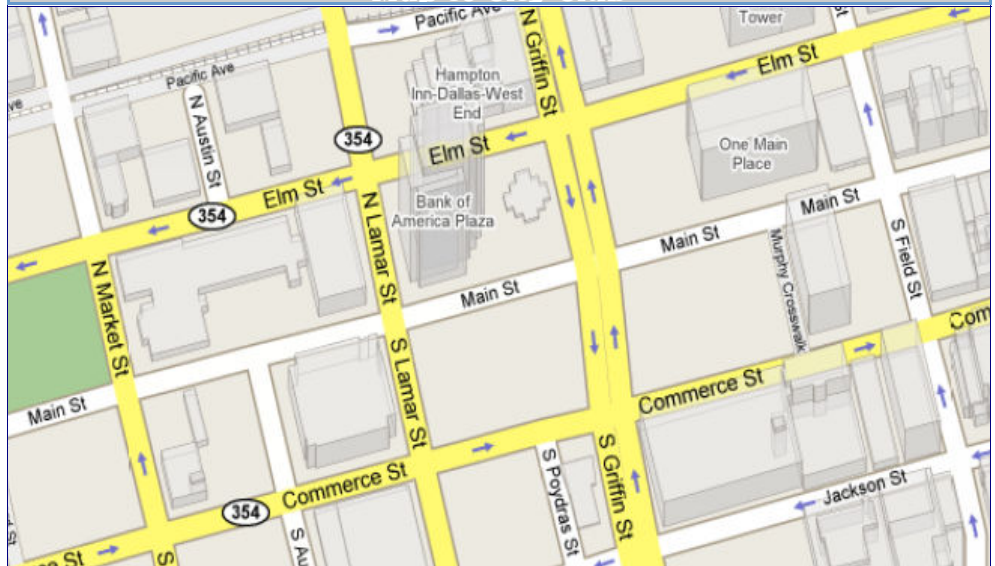

About Our Presenter. . .

Michael Hansen is a Senior Financial Auditor for the Government Accountability Office (GAO) in Dallas. He has been with GAO for almost 9 years and most of his work has focused on the U. S. government wide consolidated financial statements (CFS) audit. He leads key audit work in the complex audit issue area of federal loans receivable and loan guarantee liabilities, and work at the Department of Education. Before coming to GAO, Michael was a manager at Navigant Consulting. He received both an undergraduate degree in Finance and his MBA in Accounting from the University of Texas at Arlington. He is a Certified Public Accountant and stays abreast of accounting and auditing issues. Michael will provide an overview on the components of the federal government's financial report. As most of you know, financial reports and the associated auditor's report communicate financial and related information about an entity. Although there are current financial problems that impede federal auditors from expressing any opinion on the CFS, Michael will help us to gain a baseline understanding of the primary components that make up the federal consolidated financial report (i.e., Department of the Treasury's government wide consolidated financial statements).

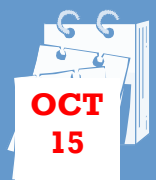

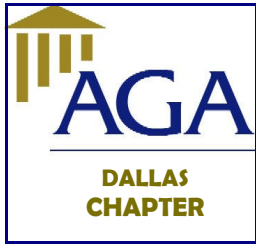
As an AGA member, do you want to expand your professional opportunities and skill sets or distinguish yourself from others in this competitive work environment?

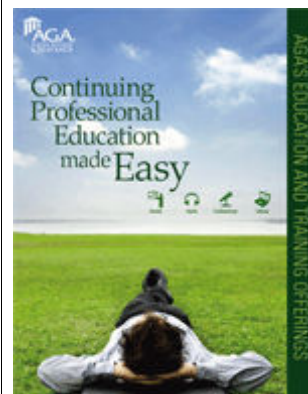
